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Supplementary Regulations

1. Chelmsford Motor Club will promote a National B Autocross on the 19th August 2007 near Sawbridgeworth, Hertfordshire.
2. The meeting will be governed by the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association Ltd (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Regulations and any written instructions the organising club may issue for the event.
3. The MSA Permit No: TBA.
Home Counties Championship number: CHS2007/079
4. The event is open to all fully elected members of the organising club, championship contenders in the Home Counties Autocross Championship, the Burton Power East Anglian Championship and members of motor clubs affiliated to the following associations. Proof of membership and MSA competition licences will be inspected at signing on.

5. The event is a qualifying round of The Home Counties Autocross Championship and the Burton Power East Anglian Championship.
6. All competitors must produce a valid club membership card, competition licence and championship registration card (if applicable) at Signing-On.
7. The programme for the meeting will be:
Scrutineering 8.30 am
Signing-On 8.45 am
Practice 10.00 am
First Timed Run ASAP after practice.
Any competitor not signed on by 10.00 am may be excluded.
8. The length of the course is approximately 1200 metres per lap and consists of right and left hand bends on a stubble field.
9. The event will consist of the following classes:
A1: Economy Standard Production Saloons up to 1600cc
A2: Economy Standard Production Saloons over 1600cc
A3: Endurance cars (K22.21)
B: Cars up to 1400cc
C: Cars over 1400cc up to 1650cc
D: Cars over 1650cc.
E: Specials and any other car not eligible for the above classes, including any Four Wheel Drive vehicles, which will be subject to a 5% handicap.
F: Junior Autocross (see G6.14)
G: Minicross cars complying with MDA regulations.

Cars with forced induction will be subject to a 40% capacity increase.

The organisers reserve the right to amalgamate and create new classes depending on entries.

Technical Regulations:

- (i) Vehicles must comply with Vehicle Regulations E.12 and G.5 of the 2007 MSA Yearbook.
 - (ii) Details of permitted modifications are within the MSA Autocross Vehicle Regulations specified in G.6.
 - (iii) Tyres are free except that no hand cut racing tyres are permitted.
 - (iv) G6.2.1 applies to Class A only; G6.2.3 is deleted; G6.3.5 applies to Classes B to D and G6.8.2 applies to Class E.
10. Awards will be presented for fastest times as follows:
Fastest time of the day
1st in Class
2nd in Class (subject to 4 starters)
3rd in Class (subject to 8 starters)
Best Chelmsford Motor Club member (member on 1st July 2007)
Best team of 3 cars (lowest sum of fastest time, £5 per team)

No competitor may win more than one award other than Best Team or Best Chelmsford award. Awards should be collected in person or by a representative; they may not be posted on.

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11. The entry list opens on publication of these SRs and closes finally on Saturday 11th August 2007. The entry fee is £45. All entries must be made on the official entry form, accompanied by the appropriate fee and either posted or hand delivered to the event secretary. For double driven cars each driver must complete a separate entry form. Entries received after the closing date are at the organisers discretion and will be subject to a £5 surcharge.

13. The maximum number of entries for the event is 60, the minimum is 25. The minimum for each class is 3. Should any of the above minimum figures not be reached, the organisers reserve the right to either cancel the event or amalgamate classes as necessary. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt. Entry fees will be refunded in full up to the closing date, after the closing date they will be subject to a £5.00 administration fee.

15. Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after the final timed runs and made final 30 minutes after being posted.
16. Any protest must be lodged in accordance with GR.O.5.
17. Starting order will be determined by class. Cars will start in groups of one or two cars, 3 start groups (of one car) or 2 start groups (of two cars) is the maximum number of cars on the course at any one time. The start signal will be by lights or flag. The method of timing will be electronic. The finish line will be denoted by flag or board.
18. Competitors will have the opportunity of one practice run consisting of 3 laps.
19. Competitors will be identified by competition numbers which will be allocated by the organisers. A supply of competition numbers will be available on the day. Identification numbers must be displayed on both sides of the competing car. Where a car is double driven, the numbers not applicable must be completely masked. If this is not done, the MSA Timekeeper may not issue a time and in that case, a re-run will not be permitted.
20. Marking and penalties will be as printed in the appropriate section of the MSA General Regulations.
21. All other GRs of the MSA apply as written except for the following, which are modified:
- G4.6.1. Each driver will be given the opportunity of three timed runs, time and weather permitting, with the fastest run to count in the results. B10.1.3 Cars may be entered in the same class twice, but must be driven by different drivers. Separate completed entry forms are required for each entry.
22. Each marshal is a judge of fact for circuit penalties, 4 wheels off course, baulking, forceful driving. Marshals names will be available at race control, and a start line judge will be appointed for false starts.
23. Competitors attention is drawn to the regulation requiring flame resistant overalls (G4.5.1 (c) and G4.5.2)
24. Refreshments will be available from the caterer in the paddock. Please support this facility.
25. Toilets will be on site. There will be no water or fuel available on site.
26. Please take your litter home with you, children must be supervised and any pets must be kept on a lead. No motorcycles, scooters, quad bikes etc. to be used on the venue. Any area outside of the Paddock is out of bounds.
28. Final Instructions will be posted on the Tuesday prior to the event.
29. Acknowledgements: Venue owner, MSA, club officials, marshals and all others who have enabled this event to run.
