Regulations for the

2026 AMSC Targa Challenge

1. The Challenge is based on results achieved on the series of Targa Rallies being promoted individually by the participating clubs during 2026.
2. The challenge is run by the Anglia Motor Sport Club (AMSC) and is open to all members of that club and invited clubs to each challenge round.
3. Eligible competitors will be automatically registered to accumulate points on entering a qualifying round and as members of the Anglia Motor Sport Ltd (and its member clubs).

8. The Challenge:

Class definitions vary between events, and some events will be split by interclub and clubman permits.

The Challenge will be based on position in class in the published results for each event. The Driver and Navigator with the highest number of points will be the overall Challenge winners.

For any event which does not allow double driving (such as the Tour of Dengie Targa), both crewmembers will be awarded driver and navigator points so neither is disadvantaged by the event format.

9. Eligibility rules will be as the standard rules applied to each event.

10. Eligible cars.

See Ch 13 App 11C of the 2026 Motorsport UK National Competition Rules.

11. Awards:

Awards will be presented as follows:

1st to 10th overall Driver

1st to 10th overall Navigator

12. Scoring:

Points will be awarded on all events based on the event class positions as follows:

1st 15 2nd 13 3rd 12 and so on until 14th and lower 1

The 3 highest scores will count

Should 3 or less events run all scores will count

A driver scoring points on an individual event **can** score Navigator points on that event.

Additional Organiser/Marshal points can be scored, see paras 14, 15 & 16.

13. Ties will be decided in favour of the driver / navigator with the greatest number of highest scores and if this fails to resolve the tie, the greatest number of next highest scores, and so on. Then by the best overall position on the earliest events both tied competitors took part in. Awarded organiser points will not be used to settle a tie, as these are mandatory values.

14. Organiser points: Competitors electing to organise a 2026 Targa Challenge event as Clerk of Course / Secretary or Chief Marshal, will be awarded points, equivalent to a maximum Challenge class score (15 points). Organiser points can only be awarded for organising one 2026 Targa Challenge event. Marshals and other named officials present at the event will be awarded 10 points.

15. Organiser points will be accumulated separately and will not affect the maximum number of rounds (para 12).

16. Organiser and Marshal points will be awarded automatically where the information is available, or can be claimed by emailing arm@chelmsfordmc.co.uk
